

PROFESSOR INDERMIT GILL

Chief Economist, World Bank and Senior Vice President for Development Economics



Professor Indermit Gill is Chief Economist of the World Bank and Senior Vice President for Development Economics. Before starting this position on September 1, 2022, Professor Gill served as the World Bank's Vice President for Equitable Growth, Finance, and Institutions, where he helped shape the Bank's response to the extraordinary series of shocks that have hit developing economies since 2020. Between 2016 and 2021, he was a Professor of Public Policy at Duke University and Non-resident Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution's Global Economy and Development program.

Professor Gill led the World Bank's influential 2009 World Development Report on economic geography. His work includes introducing the concept of the "middle-income trap" to describe how countries stagnate after reaching a certain level of income. He has published extensively on key policy issues facing developing countries—among other things, sovereign debt vulnerabilities, green growth and natural-resource wealth, labor markets, and poverty and inequality.

Professor Gill has also taught at Georgetown University and the University of Chicago. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Chicago.
